Trash/Recycling Updates

Our last newsletter alluded to more changes in trash/recycling in Baltimore County. Here's the latest:

- Beginning April 1, 2022, the County will require all separate yard material collection to be placed in paper bags, and will no longer accept plastic bags for yard waste.
- The county will accept larger weight and capacity limits, up to 45 pounds and 45 gallons for garbage cans.
- Starting January 1, 2022, scheduled collection days which fall on or after a holiday will slide to one day later that week, regardless of type of trash collected.
- The county will introduce bulk collection this year and the dates are March 10th and August 31st for our neighborhood. Details on acceptable items can be found on the Baltimore County website.



Safety Update: Top Fire Hazards



After learning that a number of homes caught fire this past year in our neighborhood and surrounding area, not to mention nationally, it begs the question, "what are the biggest fire hazards in homes and how can they be prevented?" Here are the top 15 fire hazards and how to prevent them:

- 1. Space Heaters keep them at least 3 feet from clothing, draperies, furniture, stuffed animals, and never leave them unattended while on.
- 2. Smoke Detector make sure you test regularly and replace batteries every year.
- 3. Cooking The grease in an unattended frying pan catches fire and ignites nearby combustibles. These types of fires need to be smothered with a heavy metal lid, not with water, which will spatter and exacerbate a grease fire. Also avoid turning up the heat too high while cooking and keep your stove clean to avoid buildup that burns.
- 4. Overloaded extension cords, hidden electrical shorts, bad connections, and oversized bulbs and fixtures can ignite nearby combustibles and lead to a big fire.
- 5. Appliances Clothes piled too close to a gas water heater, or excessive lint in clothes dryers cause seven percent of home fires. Be sure to clean the lint screen and dryer exit vents regularly.
- 6. Fireplaces Have your chimney swept annually, and keep flammable materials and children away from the fireplace.

Don't use lighter fluid or charcoal to get your fire started.

- 7. Sawdust clean up immediately as it's highly combustible.
- 8. Loose outlets or switches causes dangerous arcing leading to sparks
- 9. Old laptops, antiques with old wiring should be updated with proper batteries or wiring.
- 10. Glassware or mirrors in direct sunlight can refract to the point of combustion. Keep them out of the path of combustibles if sunlight is prevalent.
- II. Exposed incandescent light bulbs, especially in clothes closets, can get too hot, so they should be switched to lower temperature LEDs.
- 12. Dust bunnies and paper piles should be minimized for their combustibility.
- 13. Barbecue grills should never be underneath any part of the house, and be sure to keep the grease trap clean between uses. Take care to follow manufacturers recommendations on reigniting a grill if it goes out.
- 14. Smoking moving to the garage to avoid smoking in the house is a bad idea given the number of combustibles typically stored there.
- 15. 9V batteries can spark against steel wool or other metal objects. Make sure to tape the posts, or keep them in their original packaging while storing them.

Lastly, be sure to keep matches, lighters, candles, stove tops or ovens out of reach or secured from children. Stay Safe!!
